
Goals of the project


- · what is AIDS?

Need for work in the area of AIDS awareness

- · current programs for AIDS awareness
- · mindsets of people

Concepts

- · make a documentary on old age home an people who stay away from their families
 - · portraying their lifestyle now and before
 - · why they were forced to live away from their families
 - · their point of view on role of elderly in the society.



Concepts

- · make a fiction film on one (or more) case studies that I came across
 - · that would pick up and interweave the stories that I came across.
 - · have control over the contents and point that I want to make with the film
 - · can have absolute control over the total length of the film



Concepts

- · make a documentary for AIDS awareness
 - · interview people with AIDS and their families.
 - · interview doctors and nurses who treat these patients and other staff of the hospitals like MSW
 - · point of view of people from different strata's of the society.



Final Concept

the final concept is a mixture of two concepts; making a fiction film which is shot in a documentary form.

using documentary style

people reacting to fictitious situations

the story building up with comments from one person on the other

using rotoscopy as a device
specific to general look
different medium to explore
realistic sketching style



Process followed

- · shooting the whole film
- · editing
- · drawing on paper
- · syncing with sound
- · final editing.



Explorations with sketching





the story of the film was an inspiration from a real case study ...

- · an old lady admitted to the hospital because of a fractured foot
- · had three sons
- · the youngest son died of AIDS
- · the old lady took care of her dying son

· now her family (her other two sons) think that she is also infected

- · now they are not taking her back home
- · old lady died in the hospital



the script was a result of lot of refining from the initial to the final stage ...

Major blocks of the story:

- · Old lady telling about herself
- · Other patients who had been with her in the same ward telling about her
- · Nurse telling about her having three son's.
- · Old lady defending her family
- · The counselor of the hospital telling about her son's death with AIDS, and her family's denial to him after hearing about his disease.
- · The Nurse telling about the reason behind not taking her back
- · The family's reaction to the whole issue

script

one of the technique used for writing the screenplay was to state intentions and then find out possible reactions ...

INTENTIONS

- · set the premise of the place as Mumbai
- · build up the context that Mai is hospitalized
- · tell about Mai and her family
- · about her duties (looking after grandchildren)
- · tell about her condition now
- · tell that she is neglected by her family and give a hint why
- · she has given her hope of living
- · tell about her dead son
- · tell the reason why her son's not taking her back
- · her family's reaction to the whole situation
- · narrator tells Mai is dying
- · mai dies and the film end
- · the routine continues with the Nurse's voice-over



Narration

- · the shooting was done in two parts; the interview and the filling shots
- · needed a simple narration
- · telling a complex story in a short duration of time was a challenge
- · narrator of the story was another important consideration
- · mai's son, who died to narrate the story
- · writing a poetry as the narration
