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ABSTRACT

In these countries, there are events like dowry, eve teasing, sexual harassment, rape, female infanticide, physical violence and many more.

INTRODUCTION

Scope:

The project essentially contextualizes the issue of gender discrimination, which is a prime issue in the development of a country. The project strategize to target the section of the people which are directly liable with this issue. Primary targets are middle the people of India. The core philosophy of the project addresses the fundamental question of discrimination on a humanitarian approach. Thus the project shall handle diverse issues relating to gender discrimination in other countries as well. The content can be altered and contextualized to a specific targeted group of people and the structure can be implemented to be utilized elsewhere. The project also has the scope of addressing any other form of awareness base campaigns and NGO related programs.

RESEARCH WORK

BACKGROUND LITERATURE

As per the literature, female child has always been treated inferior to a male child and this thought is deeply engraved in the mind of both the genders. Due to this inferior treatment from the very beginning of their childhood, they fail to understand their basic 'human rights'. Asian and African countries are the most affected. In India, due to the female Infanticide, there are only 927 women per 1000 men in India. People neglect girl child and prefer a male child. Even if a girl child is born, they impose all kinds of social construct on them.

The world follows a social system, which is called 'Patriarchy' in which the male gender is basically the primary authority. They take control of property, occupy the roles of political leadership, and where the fathers are the one who holds the authority over his family. It implies the institutions of male dominance over female genders.

Feminism is a term which asks for the right of equality in genders. It defines patriarchy as a biased and unjust social rule, which is oppressive to woman. As a feminist and political theorist Carole Pateman writes, "The patriarchal construction of the difference between masculinity and femininity is the political difference between freedom and subjection." According to feminist theories, the concept of patriarchy is fluid and loosely defined. Due to this female are often dominated by male. It is a social construction and it can be overcome by revealing and critically analyzing its manifestations.

BACKGROUND STUDY

There are many types of discriminations and violence against the female gender that makes women feel inferior to men. One issue leads to other issues. Following are some of the notable issues:

Female Child Infanticide

Female infanticide is the deliberate killing of newborn female children. In countries like India and China, parents are selective for their new born babies. They don't want a girl to be born and are biased towards a boy. This practice is the reason for the death of millions of girl child and is a major cause of the unbalanced ratio of girls to boys. In India there are 921 girls to 1000 boys. Due to the patriarchal society, it creates a bias against women.

Eve Teasing

Eve Teasing is a problem in almost all the countries. During an eve teasing, a woman is passed unwanted sexual remarks and sometimes advances of a man in a public place. Sometimes it leads to the crime like rapes and murders.

Physical/Sexual Harassment

Sexual harassment is basically a form of bullying, where a person who is stronger, generally men, try to make unwanted sexual advances, request for sexual favors or obscene remarks to a woman, and threatened them not to tell anybody. There are cases of workplaces.

Child Sexual Abuse

A child abused by an adult or older adolescent for sexual stimulation is a form of child sexual abuse or child molestation. An adult person asks or pressurize a child to engage in a sexual activity, or exposure of the genitals etc. To a child to gratify their sexual desires. Child marriage is one of the prime reasons for child sexual abuse. Due to this a child can suffer from depression, post-traumatic stress, anxiety, physical injury along with other problems. Sexual abuse by a family member can result in more serious and long term psychological trauma. Most of the abuse is performed by the male genders.

Acid Attack

Acid attack is another type of violence against women. It is a form of violent attack or assault defined as the act of throwing acid into the body of another with the intention of disfiguring the face of a girl. It damages the skin tissue, often exposing and dissolving the bones of the victim.

Rape

It is a sexual assault involving the sexual intercourse by a person or a group of people initiated against the victim without their consent. It is recognized as a crime against humanity.

Dowry

Dowry is a payment of cash or gifts or any kind of property to the groom's family during the marriage of a daughter. It is common in India to pay some amount of valuable items like jewelry, cash, furniture, crockery, cash, car, or anything else which is generally required to set up their new home. Sometimes when the bride's family is unable to fulfill their requirements, the groom's family starts abusing and violence against the bride.

Education

Few people think that there is no use of wasting money in teaching their daughter. Because some day their daughter will get married and will go to her husband's family. This is because of the Patriarchy, the women have to leave their parents' home after marriage. Reports have shown that only 26.6% women over the age of 25 have secondary education

Less Job Income

There is a theory called glass ceiling theory which states that "there is an invisible barrier that prevents someone from achieving further success." The female of the same position as a male coworker gets less paid. Due to this they are unable to advance in a business or unable to achieve success.

Portrayal of women in movies, media and video games

In most of the movies women are always portrayed as an object rather than a subject. There is a test for movies and films, called 'Bechdal Test' which is named after an American cartoonist, which states that "A work of fiction should feature at least two women who talk to each other about something other than a man and should have a name." It is a simple test, but still many contemporary works fail this test of gender bias.

Similarly, most of the video games which we have played in our childhood famous like Mario, portrays women as an object or a prize to win at the end of a game. They are used as a tool to power up male player. All these images remain in our head and somewhere, unconsciously it builds a patriarchal mind-set among us.

RESTATED BRIEF

After doing a lot of research and discussion with my guide, I realized that this area is really vast. And for making an animated short I need to have a clear idea of what I want to convey through it. I wanted to focus on one aspect and make a strong movie with strong concepts. So the next step was deciding upon the most critical area of all the problems of Gender Discrimination. After doing a lot of brainstorming, I came up with the result that most of the issues were pointing towards one aspect- female infanticide. I decided to concentrate on making a movie with a prime issue of female infanticide.

FEMALE INFANTICIDE

Female infanticide is the deliberate killing of newborn female children. Parents are selective for their new born babies. They don't want a girl to be born and are biased towards a boy. The practice has been the cause of death for millions and is a major cause of concern in several nations like India and China.

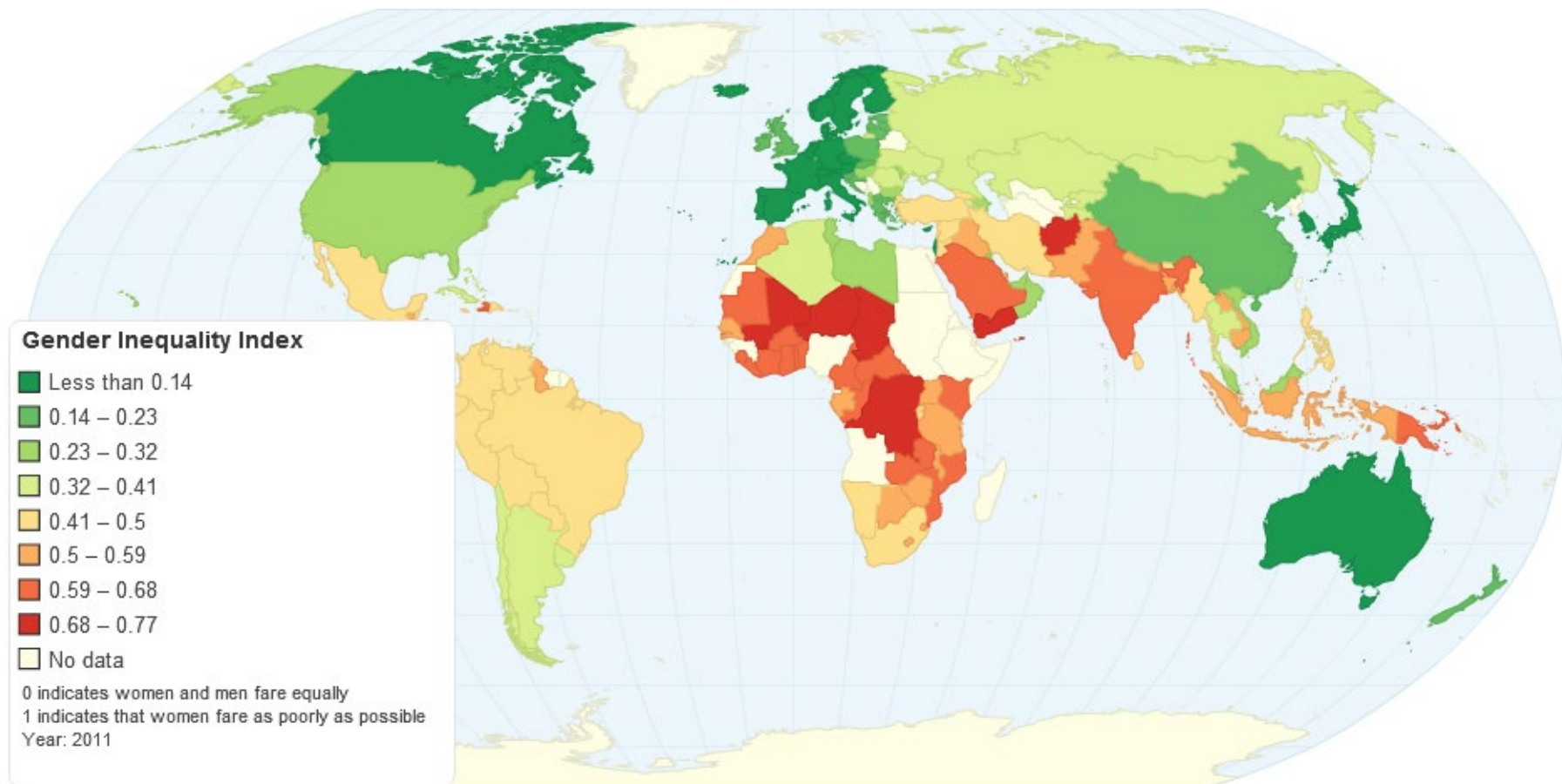

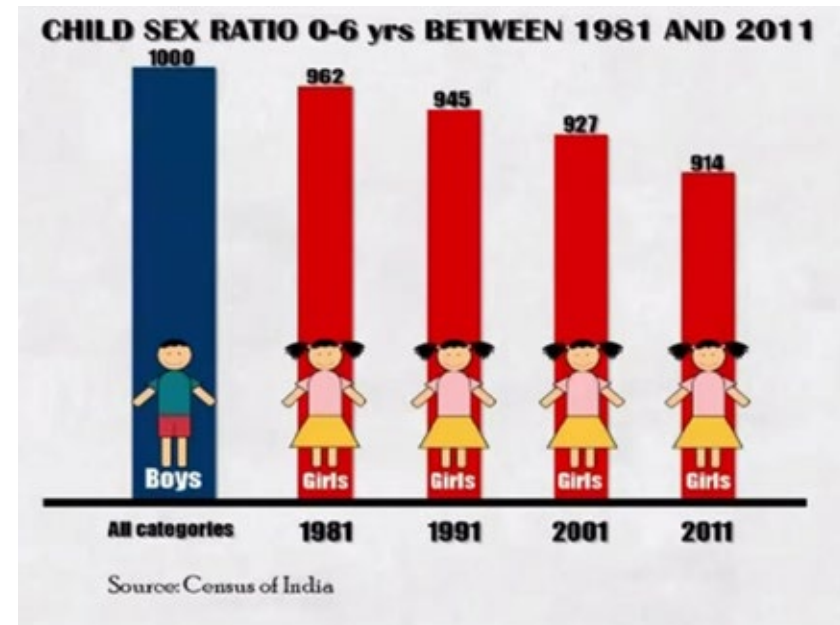

As we can see that American, European and Australian countries have respectable gender ratios. But when it comes to African and Asian countries the figures are too much. According to the survey, there are 1029 women per 1000 men in North America, 1076 women per 1000 men in Europe but only 914 women per 1000 men in India. And this figure is still going down every year.

If you think 914 women to 1000 men is not a big figure, and the difference is only 86, then see it this way. If we compare the same amount with 10,000 boys it will be 9140, if we compare with 1,00,00,000 boys it will be 9140000 girls. This gives us the difference 8,60,000. This means that every 10 years 8,60,000 girls are killed if we compare to 1 crore boys. According to the survey, 200 million girls are missing today because of the female infanticide.

She is running away from it. As fast as possible.

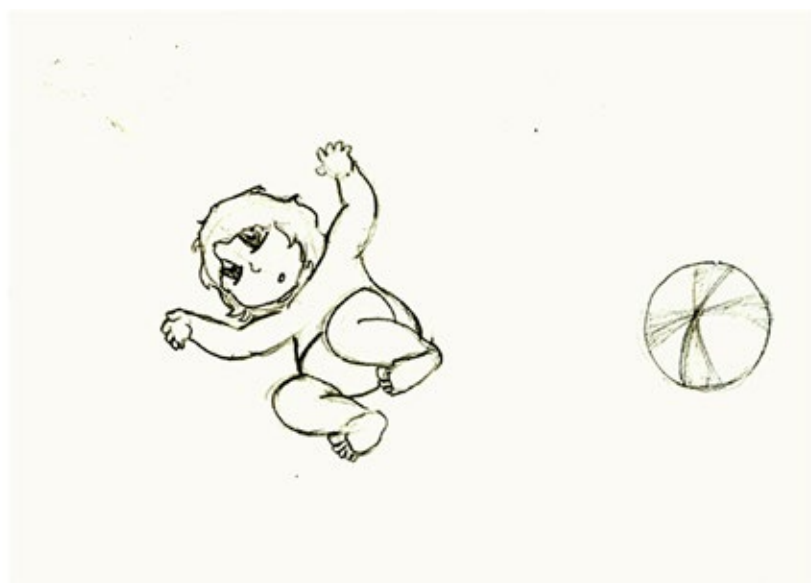
She grows up to a 14 year old girl

She starts flying

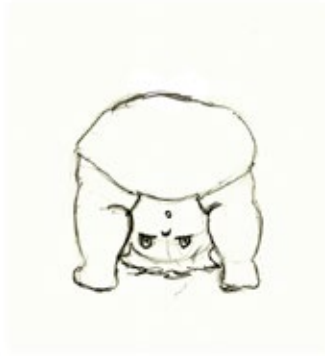
As she is flying she becomes 8 years old
